Chief Logan Reservation

Known as "the friendliest camp in the country," Chief Logan Reservation is located about 20 miles southeast of Chillicothe near Ray, Ohio. The camp encompasses 261 acres of remote, Southern Ohio charm. Sproat Lake emerges



from the rolling hills and valleys with large, lush meadows.

Chief Logan has a well-equipped Dining Hall, serving meals that are delicious and nutritious. Troops camp in open campsites with camp-provided wall tents, complete with bunks and mattresses. Campsites also feature latrines, dining flys and picnic tables. Sproat Lake supports numerous swimming and boating activities.

Camp Oyo



Situated in the heart of Shawnee State Forest's 70,000 acres, Camp Oyo is located about 13 miles northeast of Portsmouth, Ohio off of State Route 125. The camp itself is on 55 acres, but there are many opportunities for program expansion onto neighboring

lands. Camp Oyo has served thousands of Scouts since opening in 1926.

Camp Oyo offers excellent cabin (yes, even during summer camp) and tent facilities, as well as an enthusiastic staff, great food in our Dining Hall, and plenty of opportunities for Scouts and Scouters to have rip-roarin' good ol' time.

Come out and stay with us this summer; we are confident you will enjoy yourself.

Camp Otter Run

Otter Run Camp is located north of Marysville, Ohio and is designed for primitive camping. This property provides a great opportunity for Scouts to use the patrol method during an overnight or day activity.



Camp Falling Rock

Camp Falling Rock is located 11 miles north of Newark, Ohio off Route 79. More than 600 acres provide a setting of rolling hardwood forests, streams and waterfalls, and scenic

meadows. Large rock formations provide a beautiful backdrop to an historic covered bridge that has been photographed by thousands.

Enjoy spacious campsites. Wall tents, are provided complete with bunks and mattresses. Campsites also feature latrines, dining flys and picnic tables. A modern Dining Hall provides three tasty meals daily. The swimming pool is inviting on a warm summer day.



Camp Lazarus

Camp Lazarus is the home of the council's Cub Scout summer resident camps, a wide variety of training programs, and numerous weekend programs throughout the year such as Maple Syrup Festival, Cubservation Earth Day Celebration, Shoot-O-Ree, Springfest, Halloween Haunted Forest, and Tiger Christmas. Camp is located in Delaware County off State Route 23, approximately 9 miles north of Interstate 270 with easy access to Columbus and Delaware.

Camp Lazarus offers several cabins for camping, a dining hall, shooting ranges, activity fields, rustic log cabins, a large amphitheater and accessibility for the physically challenged, a swimming pool, small boating lake and a small fishing pond. The Exchange Lodge is a large, rustic cabin that is perfect for indoor ceremonies, meetings, or group social events.



Facilities available at Camp Lazarus are: dining hall, training center, ranger residence, maintenance sheds, 6 scoutmaster cabins, shower house, 4 program buildings, director's cabin and 5 program shelters.

Historic Camp Lazarus is also part of a preservation easement that will ensure its use for Scouting and protect it from commercial development.

Camp Madison Lake

Located east of London, Ohio and adjacent to Madison Lake State Park, this small property is available for day activities, picnics, and unit camping. The wooded camp offers a pavilion, an Adirondack shelter, as well as the recreational opportunities of the State Park and lake.

DIRECTIONS TO COUNCIL CAMPS

CAMP LAZARUS – (4422 Columbus Pike, Delaware 43015)

To reach Camp Lazarus, follow Route 23 north from Columbus towards Delaware. Nine miles north of I-270 on the left side of the highway, just north of the Delaware Area Career Center. Camp is two miles south of Delaware.

CAMP FALLING ROCK – (12637 Houdeshell Road, Newark 43055)

Take either St. Rt. 161 or St. Rt. 16 east to Newark. Turn north on St. Rt. 79. Go approximately 11 miles on St. Rt. 79 until you reach Township Road 210 (Rocky Fork Road). At the intersection of St. Rt. 79 and Township Road 210 there is a white barn and a sign for Camp Falling Rock. Turn left onto Township Road 210, follow this to Houdeshell Road. Turn left and proceed on it to the camp entrance.

CHIEF LOGAN SCOUT RESERVATION – (3600 Scout Camp Road, Ray 45672)

The camp is located approximately 5 miles off of U.S. Highway 35 between Chillicothe and Jackson, Ohio. If you are approaching from the west (via Chillicothe) exit left onto Elam Road. After 1½ miles and turning onto Bronx Corners Road, turn left onto Boy Scout Road. If you are approaching from the east (via Jackson), exit right onto Bronx Corners Road. After ½ mile, turn right onto Boy Scout Road. Once on Boy Scout Road, travel 2½ miles, and the road ends at John W. Barbee Road. Turn left onto John W. Barbee Road and proceed 1.2 miles to a hairpin turn. Stay to the right through the hairpin, and cautiously proceed another 1½ miles to the camp gateway. The parking lot is straight ahead past the Ranger's residence.

CAMP OYO – (168 Shawnee Road, West Portsmouth 45663)

Take St. Rt. 52 west out of Portsmouth. Go 7 miles to St. Rt. 125 north. Follow St. Rt. 125 for 6 miles to Camp Oyo. Turn right onto the forest road. The parking lot is on the left side of the road and the camp gateway is on the right side.

CAMP OTTER RUN - (7647 County Road 144, East Liberty 43319)

Take St. Rt. 33 west from Dublin towards Marysville. Continue on St. Rt. 33 till you come to the exit ramp for St. Rt. 347 in Logan County. At the curve bear left, go straight ahead to the stop sign. At the stop sign, turn left. St. Rt. 347 ends and becomes Logan County Road 144-A. Take this to the stop sign. Turn right onto County Road 144. Otter Run entrance will be 1.4 miles on your right. There is a large yellow sign (reads "Stop Ahead") just before the entrance into Otter Run.

CAMP MADISON LAKE -

From Columbus, take Interstate 70 west to U.S. Highway 42. Take US 42 south to London. In London, take State Route 665 east to Spring Valley Road. Or, take I-71 south of Columbus to SR 655, and go west to Spring Valley Road. Turn right onto Spring Valley Road to Cheseldine Rd (CR 133A). Turn right onto CR 133A, and travel over the dam, past Madison Lake State Park entrance, and to the T-intersection with CR 161. Turn left onto CR 161, and the camp entrance is on the left approximately 400 yards up the road.
