CFR Laboratories


CFR Laboratories is a new program designed after the Boy Scout's STEM initiative. We offer science and technology merit badges in a lab setting with lots of cool experiments and hands on learning.

Open Program

While at camp, not all campers are required to participate in the same activities. Each camper can spend his time accomplishing tasks that will help them advance in rank. Campers can work on merit badges and requirements of any program area at almost any time on any day of the week. Merit badges and requirements are taught one-on-one or in small groups that allow for Customized instruction and appropriate pacing for each Scout's abilities. Our Camper-Centered Philosophy allows us to match the program to each camper's level of experience.

Swimming Pool

Along with the Lakefront Activities, CFR has an Olympic size swimming pool where Scouts have an opportunity to earn various merit badges but also just enjoy time at the pool with open swim.



Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Program

The Counselor-In-Training program helps to prepare the staff of the future to maintain the excellence of our summer camp program. These participants receive hands-on training under the supervision of a dedicated staff trainer. There are two types of CIT programs, A & B.

Brownsea Program

The Brownsea Island Adventure is a specialized program for scouts who are in their first year of scouting often having just crossed over from Cub scouting, through first year scouts of all ages are encouraged to participate in the program. The program is built around the idea that rather than focusing on just completing requirements, a scout should be well trained in their skills and the completion of rank requirements is only part of the adventure. At the end of the week, hard-working Brownsea scouts will walk away with a strong foundation in basic scouting skills, several requirements from tenderfoot to First Class, and a merit badge or two go along with it.

SCUBA BSA

Scuba BSA introduces qualified Boy Scout, Venturing, and registered adult participants to the special skills, equipment, and safety precautions aquatics activities that promote fitness and recreation; and provides a foundation for those who later will participate in more advanced underwater activity. We partner with Columbus Scuba to offer classes once a week at CFR. All participants will earn the Scuba BSA patch and be issued a certificate of completion for the course. To sign up for the sessions Scouts and families must go to www.columbusbsca.com/bsa. Cost for the session is \$25.00 (assistance is available for those who may need it).



Lakefront Aquatics

Camp Falling Rock is proud to have its own man made lake. We offer several boating merit badges as well as kayaking BSA. Any individual interested in participating in aquatic activities must pass a BSA Swim test.

Shooting Sports

Not only are there rifle ranges, and shotgun ranges, Camp Falling Rock also offers a large archery range with 8 available stations to ensure all shooters plenty of time to fulfill their merit badge requirements. Scouts will also receive instruction in a brand new shooting sports pavilion.

National Accreditation

All Simon Kenton Council summer camps are accredited by the Boy Scouts of America. Visited annually by a team knowledgeable and trained in camping standards, our camps maintain a top rating for their facilities, programs and staff.
