Boy Scout Resident Camp

Chief Logan Scout Reservation is located outside of Chillicothe, near Ray, Ohio. Chief Logan offers more than 60 merit badges for Scouts. With an open and flexible program and the friendliest staff you will ever meet, your Scouts are sure to have an awesome summer camp experience! Highlights of camp include the climbing tower, zip line, black powder, gaga ball, brown sea island, nature, handicraft, and much more!

Foothills First-Year Camper Program

This program helps Scouters to complete all camp-related requirements for the Tenderfoot, Second Class and First Class ranks. It allows first-year Scouts to be introduced into the open program and camp traditions along with exposing them to all program areas and events. The Foothills program emphasizes teamwork and leadership through the patrol method and prepares first-year Scouts to enter the Frontiersman program the following summer.

Frontiersman Program

This program emphasizes camp spirit and provides a challenge to older campers and adults, which enhances basic camping and wilderness survival skills, leadership, camaraderie and self-confidence. This program is great for campers & adults that are looking for a challenge! There are four awards that can be earned: the Pioneer, Trapper, Mountain Man and Simon Girty Award. A camper must be at least 12 years old and first class to participate.

Scuba

Scuba BSA introduces participants to the skills, equipment, and safety precautions associated with scuba diving; encourages aquatics activities that promote fitness and recreation; and provides a foundation for those who later will participate in more advanced underwater activity. The Scuba BSA program is conducted by an instructor certified by diving organizations recognized by the BSA. Scuba BSA is not a diver certification. Participants will need to be swimmers, complete the release form / medical statement, and pay an additional \$25.00 program fee on line at www.columbuscuba.com



Open Program at CLR

We pride ourselves on having an open program system where each camper can choose to spend time accomplishing tasks that will help him advance in rank. Campers can work on merit badges and requirements of any program area at almost any time on any day of the week. Traditional Summer Camp


- Merit Badge Focused recommended for 2nd & 3rd Year Campers.

Camp Falling Rock

Boy Scout Resident Camp

Located 11 miles north of Newark, Ohio, Camp Falling Rock sits on more than 600 acres of land with rolling hardwood forests, streams and waterfalls, and scenic meadows. Large rock formations provide a beautiful backdrop to a historic covered bridge.

Open Program

While at camp, not all campers are required to participate in the same activities as others. Each camper can spend his time accomplishing tasks that will help him advance in rank. Campers can work on merit badges and requirements of any program area at almost any time on any day of the week.

Brownsea Program

The Brownsea Island Adventure is a specialized program for Scouts who are in their first year of Scouting often having just crossed over from Webelos, though, first year scouts of all ages are encouraged to participate in the program. At the end of the week, Brownsea scouts will walk away with a strong foundation in basic scouting skills, several requirements from Tenderfoot to First Class, and a merit badge or two go along with it.

Shooting Sports

Not only are there rifle ranges and shotgun ranges, Camp Falling Rock also offers a large archery range with 8 available stations to ensure all shooters plenty of time to fulfill their merit badge requirements.

CFR Labs

If you love science this is the place for you. Held in Falling Rock's Franklin Lodge, CFR labs is the home to our science and technology program. Fourteen STEM merit badges are taught here with only four being scheduled in a closed program format. It is one of our more popular areas and offers many merit badges that are not usually offered in a camp setting! It is strongly recommended that Scouts have their cyber chip prior to camp to fully enjoy CFR Labs.

Lakefront Aquatics

Camp Falling Rock is proud to have its own man made lake. We offer several boating merit badges as well as kayaking BSA. Any individual interested in participating in aquatic activities must pass a BSA Swim test.

Cub Camping Frequently Asked Questions and Concerns

Q. Are there discounts for attending both Webelos Resident and Day Camp?

A. Yes, if you participate in both camps, you will receive \$10 off your resident camp fees.

Q. What is the difference between Webelos Resident Camp and Day Camp?

A. Resident Camp is an overnight experience that includes meals and tent camping. Each camp will offer separate crafts, sports, advancement, science activities and its own unique experiences. Day Camp is the first step in the camping progression. Scouts spend each day with the same group and visit a variety of program stations. At the end of the day they return home.

Q. Are Camperships available?

A. A limited number of Camperships are available to help cover the cost of Day Camp for those most in need. March 1, 2017 is the deadline for submitting Campership applications. Applications are available through your Cubmaster or online at skcscouts.org/camping-forms.

Q. Do Tigers need an Adult Partner to come to camp with them?

A. Yes. According to BSA Policy, Tiger's must have an adult at camp with them.

Q. Can Lions register for Day Camp?

A. No. Youth not registered in the 2016-2017 school year can not register for Day Camp.

Q. What rank do I register my youth for?

A. You register based on what grade your child will be in in the fall.
