Please take the time to complete the Award Recommendation Form for a Volunteer who has rendered service to a Cub Pack, Scout Troop, Venture Crew, or District during the year. This is your way to say "Thank You" to a leader for their service to the youth of the District.

Follow the directions and complete the form as completely as possible. Fill-in nominee's and nominator's information, don't forget addresses, phone number, and email address. Explain why the individual is deserving recognition, what did they do that was more than their position required?

Award Requirements:

All individuals must support District and Council initiatives and standards.

Bridge Builder: This individual must have shown significant service to Scouting during the past year at the Unit or District Level. The individual does not need to be a registered Scouter.

Bronze: This individual must have been awarded the Bridge Builder and must have the training required for their position and two years of service.

Silver: This individual must have been awarded the Bronze award and have at least three years of service and be currently active in Unit or District.

Gold: This individual must have the Silver award, at least four years of service to Unit or District, be a role model, have been recognized by at least two of the Committee member or strong nomination letters and be currently an active leader in a Unit or District.

David Katonak Memorial Award: This award is for a Scouter who has served a minimum of 10 years to Scouting in the District and who has received all of the volunteer nominated awards presented by the District.

National District Award of Merit: This individual shall have earned the Gold award, have a multi-year history of service to Units and/or District, name recognition among District Scouters and a demonstration of leadership.

The District Recognition Committee will make sure each nominee is considered for the proper award.
