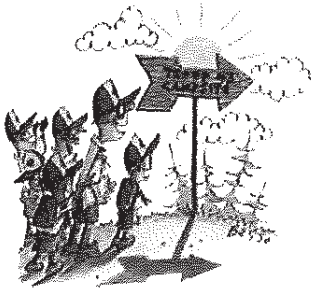


# Webelos Weekend in the Woods

# **Webelos Weekend in the Woods 2017**

Webelos Leaders if your Den is planning on camping for the weekend the following are some suggestions for items needed for the campout and the weekend. You could prepare/plan ahead of time with a Boy Scout unit. This is not absolutely necessary but is helpful. It allows your webelos to see how boy scouts do their campouts.

The following are some suggestions for meals to prepare.

## **Food Suggestions**

**Friday Dinner**-easy meal subs or sandwiches or you can eat before you come

**Friday Cracker Barrel**-bring and item to share with everyone

**Saturday Breakfast**-Ziploc Omelets, breakfast burritos, easy oatmeal or cereal

**Saturday Dinner**-pie iron pizzas, stew, soup, Dutch oven meals

**Saturday Evening Snack**-Dutch oven Dessert competition

**Sunday Breakfast**-quick cereals, pancakes/French toast and ham slices

You can also look on-line for delicious recipes and ideas for Webelos overnight camping food.

## **Suggested Camping Equipment**

Tent

Waterproof ground cloth or plastic sheet

Sleeping bag, pillow, air mattress or pad

Mess kit, with plate, cup and utensils or group ops to use paper and plastic utensils

Cooking gear, relative to what you will need for your meals

Cook stove, propane

Lanterns: battery or propane

Clean up gear for washing dishes, wash pans, bleach for sanitizing, soap (suggest making meals such that you minimize the need for this such as; dutch ovens, cast iron griddles, pie irons, cast iron skillets, box ovens.

Dining fly, small folding table (for cooking prep), coolers for perishable foods

Critter proof storage for your dry food items

Camp chair

### Clothing

Scouts should bring their uniform

Raincoat/warm coat, gloves, warm hat

Durable shoes/boots

Extra socks, shoes, extra clothing

### Toiletries

Toothbrush/toothpaste    Wash Cloth

Flash light

Soap in a container

Personal first-aid kit

Water bottle

## SCHEDULE FOR WEBELOS WEEKEND 2017—With Times

### Friday November 3rd

Arrive Otter Run starting at 530 pm. Have someone from your group check in and pay your registration at the shelter after you arrive drop off your food for the lunch pot and Food drive donations. I will have roster forms for you to fill out. Each Pack/Group will set up own campsite at area arranged. Groups can have dinner in their sites. However most will eat before arriving.

8 pm—meet at Shelter House for a Cracker barrel and for introductions of groups and staff. Final schedule will be given to each group at that time.

10 pm—lights out.

### Saturday November 4th

7:00 am—wake up and breakfast for each Pack at their campsites or if needed, at the shelter house.

8:30am—Opening Ceremony/Flag Ceremony at the flagpoles with review of the stations and time line for the day. Will also do Scout Oath and Law. Class A uniforms. After flag ceremony, can change into class B uniforms for activity stations

9:am—Start at initial station

9:45am—rotate to next station

9:50 am—second station begins

10:35 am—rotate to next station

10:40 am—third station

11:30 am—break for lunch. Lunch will be in the Shelter house

12:45 pm—return from lunch, rotate to next station

12:50 pm—fourth station

1:35 pm—rotate to next station

1:40 pm—fifth station

2:25pm—rotate to last station

2:30 pm—last station

3:15—afternoon break—free time—play games, visit other campsites

5:00 pm—return to campsites for dinner—prepare meals and also work on campfire skits/songs.

7:00pm—meet at shelter for the dutchoven dessert competition then to the campfire—each group should have a skit and /or song to perform.

9 pm-return to campsites for evening snack/dessert

10 pm—lights out

## Sunday November 5th

7 am—wake up and breakfast, clean up campsite, pack up

8:30 to 9 am—gather at the shelter house for a worship service. Class A uniforms

9:30 am—break camp and head home.
