ADULT SUPERVISION AT SCOUT MEETINGS



For EVERY Cub Scout, Boy Scout and Venturing meeting (including *Den Meetings* and *Eagle Projects*) there must be 2 deep leadership

which consists of TWO (2) REGISTERED leaders over the age of 21. If the meeting includes female Scouts, at least one female YPT trained leader must be present. [Information](#) See "Adult Supervision"

Questions have arisen about a Scoutmaster Conference, Merit Badge Counseling and District Advancement review of an Eagle Scout project. In all 3 cases, a second adult can be within the area and it can be a scout's parent or guardian and they do not have to be a YPT trained leader. "In situations requiring a personal conference, the meeting is to be conducted with the knowledge and in view of other adults and/or youth." [Youth Protection FAQ](#)

TEMPORARY TRANSITION RULES



With the addition of female troops on February 1, 2019, BSA has instituted some TEMPORARY transition rules.

Any Scout who is over 16 or not yet 18 on **Feb 1, 2019**, can request an extension to having to complete the requirements for Eagle Scout before their 18th birthday. This extension is only available to those joining before December 31, 2019. [Information](#) - Scroll down to "On Increasing Advancement". Specific steps required for a unit to apply are at the end of the newsletter. *These rules only apply to this specific group of Scouts*. All other requests for extension must follow the steps in the 2019 Guide to Advancement, Section 9.



BALOO TRAINING

"**New Cub Scout**": Cub Scout recruited in the spring.

"**Youth of Program Volunteer**": Cub Scout who's parent is either walking five days or staffing our camp. Saves \$10. [Email me](#) for the super-secret password.

"**Adult Participant**": aka WALKERS - the folks who supervise and herd the cats from station to station. We like to have 1 for every 5 cub scouts sent by your unit. If you walk 5 days, you can get \$10 off of your scout's fee by registering them as a "Youth of Program Volunteer."

"**Adult Program Volunteer**": aka STAFF - The folks who are running stations, helping in the office, etc. [Email](#) for the super-secret password.

"**Youth Program Volunteer**" aka Youth STAFF - Must be registered with a Scouts BSA troop, Venturing Crew, or Sea Scouts ship. [Email](#) for the super-secret password.

WHAT'S SO SPECIAL ABOUT DAY CAMP?



Being at Day Camp is one of the highlights of a Cub Scout's year. But not all families are familiar with the opportunities and FUN that Day Camp offers. Your Pack can arrange for an experienced team of Day Campers to come to a meeting (pack meeting, parent meeting, Blue & Gold Banquet) and tell everyone about the awesome adventures planned for 2019. OVERCOMING CHALLENGES TO ATTENDING DAY CAMP



COST - Fundraising - some packs build day camp into their popcorn incentives. Other fundraisers could be considered.

TRANSPORTATION - Form carpools among the members of your den and/or pack. **Assign** a day camp transportation chair to organize carpools. **Reach out to other packs** in your area to form carpools. **Discuss** possibility of **van/bus rental** that could be a shared expense for your group.

ADULT PARTICIPANTS - many people can't get a week off work to do day camp. **Organize workpools** with your den or pack. The same Adult Participant does not need to attend every day. Example: if your den has five scouts, each parent takes one day. Adult participants do not need to be parents! **Any caring adult** in a scout's life may attend as an Adult Participant: Grandparents, aunts and uncles, siblings aged 21+, nannies, babysitters, and other caregivers are welcome. Consider **reaching out to your chartered organization** for help! Many churches have entire congregations of retired people who would love the opportunity to get to know your scouts and spend a day at camp. (They must be willing to take the Youth Protection Training.) **Offer to help behind the scenes** - duties include promoting day camp, getting information out to parents in a timely manner, including medical forms, what to bring, how to register, and campership information, picking up tee shirts and setting up carpools.

DATE DOESN'T WORK FOR MY DEN/PACK/FAMILY - [Attend another camp!](#) You can sign up for any camp that works for you!

DAY CAMP IS A GROUP EFFORT - Your council day camp is not run by "those council folks," or "They and Them." Putting a day camp together is a team effort, coordinated by volunteers, and everyone's help is wanted and needed! Whether it's sharing information with your pack, helping to transport and shepherd the campers, or even joining as a member of the staff, the most successful day camps are a "We and Us" activity.
