### <u>CAMP FALLING ROCK</u> 2020 Scouts BSA Resident Camp Program Guide

To help you prepare for your adventure at Camp Falling Rock, please review the program and prerequisite guides. Some program highlights include a revamped Evening Program Schedule, the return of the Cowboy Action Shoot, and the introduction of Frontier Fridays.

### **BLENDED PROGRAM**

We're introducing a Blended Program this year at Camp Falling Rock. Merit badges will be held in a semi-open program style. This change allows Scouts to benefit from the structure of a more closed program with the flexibility of an open program. Merit badges classes will start at the top of the hour and run for 50 minutes. Scouts do not need to schedule ahead for these classes. Some of our programs will be held on a more scheduled occurrence, this will be marked in the program guide.

### ADULT LEADER PROGRAMS

CFR offers many things for the adults, too! Trainings include: Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills, Safe Swim Defense, Safety Afloat, Climb On Safely, and other more. Adults are also encouraged to participate in all of our Scout programs as long as it doesn't interfere with the Scouts' experience.

In addition to the training opportunities, CFR has a leader lounge available for Scouters who may need to bring work to camp and have a space to concentrate. The lounge will also have coffee, office supplies, and WiFi for checking messages/email.

### FAMILY NIGHT

We're changing up Family Night! To allow for more time with family and as a Unit this year, Units will eat dinner in their campsites. Meal pickup will be at set sites at 5:30 pm (these will be communicated with units at the Sunday SPL/Scoutmaster meeting). Numbers for this meal must be shared with camp staff by the Tuesday Scoutmaster meeting. Don't worry about your trash after your meal - simply gather the garbage into the provided trash bags and camp staff pick it up before we leave for campfire. The entire camp will then gather at the flag poles at 6:30 pm to head to the Family Night Campfire.

### **FRONTIER FRIDAY**

Frontier Friday will take place on Friday afternoon and will run in place of normal program. Frontier Friday will feature many rustic, outdoorsy activities normally only seen at the Frontier Village at the Summit. This program runs from 2:00 pm-5:00 pm.

- Branding bring your leather, wood, or hats to be branded with CFR's Brand
- Tomahawk throwing
- Primitive Fire Making Flint & Steel, bow drill
- Lasso/roping steer
- Cross Cut Saw
- Rope Making

Frontier Friday isn't just for the Scouts! Scoutmasters join your admin team at the Chuck Wagon. The Chuck Wagon offers a Dutch oven cook-off between Scoutmasters. This cook-off will provide the sides and desserts for the Scoutmaster dinner that night. Your admin team will smoke up a main dish for dinner. Please plan to provide plates, cups, silverware, and beverages. *Please note that all normally scheduled program is canceled during this time.* 

## PATHWAY PROGRAM

This program will allow Scouts to attend work sessions and gain requirements they need. While Scouts are more than welcome to come to every session, it's not required. The Pathway Program will allow any campers to gain rank advancement and earn merit badges. Each session is three hours long and will focus on individual requirement types. ### EAGLES ROOST

Eagles Roost is home to the many Eagle required merit badges offered at Camp Falling Rock. These scheduled merit badges allow Scouts to receive the highest level of instruction possible. ### **CLIMBING**

Camp Falling Rock is fortunate to have a 40-foot climbing/rappelling tower and a 45foot-high section of natural cliff area. *Our cliff will be open for climbing and rappelling on Thursday during all program hours.* Per BSA guidelines, climbing programs will be halted or shut down in the event of severe weather.

- The climbing merit badge is limited to First Class Scouts OR at Scouts who at least 14 years old.
- Open climb and rappelling at the cliffs is open to all Scouts.
- Scouts are NOT allowed to bring personal climbing gear, but adults may use their own gear pending approval by the Climbing Director.
- A High Adventure Waiver MUST be signed by a parent/guardian and their Scoutmaster before Scouts can participate in ANY climbing activity.

## **ROCK RANGERS (OLDER SCOUT)**

Rock Rangers is Camp Falling Rock's new high adventure program for ages 14+. During their week at camp, Rock Rangers will spend their afternoons doing different high adventure activities. Some of these will include a canoe trip, becoming ATV certified, natural cliff face rappelling, and much more! If the Scout has completed all the activities by the end of the week, they will be recognized with the Rock Ranger Award.

### SPECIAL PROGRAMS

#### **Cowboy Action Shoot**

Grab your spurs, Stetsons, and best pair of chaps...the Cowboy Action Shoot is making a return this year to Camp Falling Rock! On Thursday evenings, Scouts will have the opportunity to shoot a .22-caliber revolver, lever action .22-caliber rifle and 12-gauge double barrel shotgun. *Due to BSA regulations Scouts must have a signed permission slip before participating. This permission slip and a Scoutmaster must be present to buy the \$15 ticket.* 

#### Scoutmaster Black Powder Shoot

On Monday night while the Scouts are enjoying Massive Mayhem Monday, Scoutmasters and adult leaders are invited to come to the rifle range to participate in a Black Powder Shoot! Different style rifles and targets will be provided. No experience? No problem! Staff takes care of the loading and cleaning - all you have to do is point and shoot.

#### **Rock Solid Leadership Program**

Are you a Scout who holds a leadership position in your Troop? Or perhaps a youth who needs to hold a leadership position for rank advancement? Then the Rock Solid Leadership Program is for you. This program will cover some of the basic leadership principles needed for working in a Troop. Program will run from 4:00 pm-5:00 pm each day (except on Friday) and Scouts who complete the program will receive the ROCK Solid Leadership Award.

### **EVENING PROGRAM**

Program doesn't just stop because it's evening time! Each night the staff will be leading the Scouts in different games and activities. These range from tye-dye to Finger Printing Merit Badge, and Fly Fishing. Below see the complete list of activities and when they are happening.
