Since joining Scouting, Redwan has started Redwan's Egyptian Ice, which is a pushcart business that sells treats.

Redwan's business enabled him to adopt Hayden Run Village Park near his house and he keeps the park clean and well taken care of. Redwan's passion for parks began when he picked up litter with his fellow Scouts at a nearby park.

For his Eagle Scout project, Redwan chose to make and install a flag-retirement box at the American Legion's William R. Schnug Memorial Post 614. Since the box was built, at least two 55-gallon drums with flags have been retired.

Cornell Robertson has served as the Franklin County Engineer since June 2017. He began his career at The Franklin County Engineer's Office in 1992 and has held positions in construction, design, and overall engineering management.

The Franklin County Engineer's Office is responsible for constructing and maintaining 800 lane miles of county roadway including 359 bridges and 185 culverts

The Engineer's office continually makes improvements to the county's roads, bridges, sidewalks, bike lanes, and shared-use-paths to meet the changing transportation needs of the county. The Engineer's office also utilizes the latest technologies for surveying, tax map maintenance, and land record keeping.

Cornell received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from The Ohio State University and is a registered Professional Engineer and Professional Surveyor in Ohio. Cornell and his wife, Jill, live in Hilliard, and they have three children who have grown up: Hayden, Blake, and Kathryn.
