This first meeting will be an introductory informational meeting where we will break the ice and share Jamboree details and logistics. Please bring a printed copy of your Medical Form parts A, B, and C and a photocopy of your insurance card.

In May, we will have a shakedown campout to learn and practice Jamboree camp life, including cooking skills. **Participation in every Troop meeting and campout is mandatory and critical to Be Prepared for a successful Jamboree.**
