We have great camp property committees and staff alumni associations who make many of these improvements happen and help take care of our camps.

Eagle Scout Project has Global Impact



John Laing, a scout in Troop 166 in Bexley, led an Eagle Scout service project to construct 40 beds to help refugee families resettling in Ohio after fleeing violence, poverty and religious persecution abroad.

"This project has been about helping families," said John.
"Their stories are crazy. A family spent 15 years in a
refugee camp in Uganda with their five kids. One of
their children has lived his entire life in a camp." Families
who have received beds so far have come from
Afghanistan, Rwanda, Congo, and Honduras. Due to
the war in Ukraine and conflicts around the globe, the
number of people forced to flee their homes in the last
year is at the highest level since records began, according
to the United Nations High Commission for Refugees.

John's passion to help refugees began a few years ago when his family brought food for a potluck Thanksgiving dinner in a local church that was housing a refugee family. After that, he was one of the founders of the Immigrant and Refugee Service Club at Bexley High School. "I knew this was an issue I could impact at my school with a group of students," said John. "We bring in immigrants, immigration lawyers and other speakers over lunch to talk about their experiences."

John, a senior at Bexley, has a variety of interests. He is an athlete who runs cross country and plays baseball. He is a musician who plays piano and trumpet. Scouting is also a major part of John's life. He joined Cub Scouts while in kindergarten for fun and outdoor adventure. "I really enjoyed being outdoors, camping and being with friends," said John. After crossing over into Scouts BSA as a fifth grader, he participated in more outdoor adventures. His favorite trips included learning how to water ski, having a camping trip on horseback, and going on high adventure trips to the BSA Sea Base in the Caribbean and BSA Northern Tier canoe base in the Boundary Waters region of Minnesota. "It's hard work, canoeing all day and portaging," said John. "It was quite the journey."

Scouting also helped John develop leadership skills. He currently serves a Junior Assistant Scoutmaster and held leadership positions including Senior Patrol Leader, Troop Guide and Troop Bugler. "Boy Scouts is more about learning skills in younger ranks and teaching them in older ranks," said John. His father, Nathan Laing, sees how scouting has helped his son grow. "Scouting is a safe place to learn. I love the scout-led model. It's not just running things at a camp out, but also planning the events," said Nathan. "I saw that play a formative role for John – having the confidence to speak publicly, to teach, to learn how to lead others." John's Eagle Scout project involved raising over \$4,500 to cover costs and leading 16 youth plus several adults in building the bed frames. The project also provided mattresses, sheets, pillows and blankets along with the beds. John is also providing stuffed animals for families with young children to welcome them totheir new home.

New BSA Camping Policy

As we prepare for the warmer months and plan for the camping season, there are two updates to the National BSA's camping policies.

The first update, or reminder, concerns Cub Scout Packs. Cub Scout Packs are only permitted to camp a single night per unit-coordinated experience. This means Pack can only camp one night as a unit. For all District or Council planned events, Packs can camp for two nights.

The second update concerns the "72-hour Rule" for Scouts BSA units. Effective September 1, 2023, all adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouts BSA activity must be currently registered in an adult fee-required position as listed or as an adult program participant, and current with Youth Protection Training. This eliminates the "72-hour rule."

If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to our camping department.

* Cub Scout Overnight Exception

Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders.
